90,000+	9/11 rescue & recovery workers
600,000	people exposed to harmful toxins at the World Trade Center <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ 37,000+ people suffering from 9/11-related illnesses➤ 1,700+ people have died as a result of these illnesses
75,000	individuals registered with the World Trade Center Health Program (WTCHP) as of June 30, 2016 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ 65,000+ of the registrants are first responders
Multiple diagnoses:	
5,400+	registrants have 9/11 related cancers <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ 4,692 cancer diagnoses are first responders➤ 6,378 separate cancers diagnosed
12%	of responders with PTSD also show cognitive impairment and 1.2% have probably dementia
12,000	individuals have 9/11-related mental health issues
32,000	individuals have aero-digestive problems, such as asthma or chronic obstructive pulmonary disease
End of 2015	Zadroga Act renewed until 2070 ensuring health benefits
Sept. 11, 2016	new legislation signed reopening World Trade Center Health Registry
